### A world leading destination for university students

Each year, over 500,000 international students enrol at a UK university. In 2021, there were nearly 140,000 Chinese students at UK universities, making the UK the leading destination for Chinese students. UK universities are renowned for excellent teaching and cutting-edge research, and UK degrees are highly valued by academics and employers worldwide.

To study in the UK, you'll need to demonstrate you have an adequate level of English. LanguageCert English exams are accepted by most universities in the UK as well as for all visa and immigration applications.

### How Do I Apply?

#### Undergraduate students

Most applications for bachelor's degrees in the UK are submitted using the UCAS application website (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service). Although the majority of universities will only accept your application through the UCAS system, some universities will accept direct applications.

#### Postgraduate students

Future Master's and PhD students can apply directly to their chosen university.

#### University application deadlines in the UK

Here are some of the most important deadlines to consider when applying for a university in the UK:

- **Mid-October:** deadline for all Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine courses
- **End of June:** deadline for international students from a non-EU/EEA country
- Many universities have different deadlines for international students (especially for graduate applicants). Check specific university deadlines on the university websites
- **August:** The UCAS Clearing process. Universities open up all their remaining places for late university applicants who still want to start their degree studies in the current academic year

## Student visa and English language requirements

All international students who want to study at a UK university are required to get a student visa. To secure a **student visa** and attend a UK university, you'll have to prove you have the English speaking, reading, writing and listening skills needed to succeed in your studies. Depending on your level of study, the English requirements for your student visa will vary:

### Degree level or above

If you are applying for a student visa to enter directly onto a bachelor or postgraduate degree, you must prove you can read, write, speak and understand English to B2 level on the **CEFR scale**. As a UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) licensed sponsor, your university can choose how to assess your level of English, which must be equivalent to at least a CEFR level B2 for visa purposes. This means that **LanguageCert International ESOL B2 Communicator** (including the online version) can be used as proof of English language ability for both university admission and to satisfy your visa requirement. The level of English required by UK Visas and Immigration is often lower than what is required by universities for admission purposes, and it is advisable that you check with your university directly.

### Below degree level

If you are applying for a student visa to study below degree level (e.g. foundation, pathway or other pre-session course), you must prove you can read, write, speak and understand English to B1 level on the **CEFR scale** by taking a Secure English Language Test (SELT) such as **LanguageCert International ESOL SELT B1 Listening, Reading, Writing & Speaking**. Your university may have additional English language requirements for admission purposes, and it is advisable that you check with them directly.

## Using LanguageCert exams to study in the UK

As an Awarding Organisation dedicated to language skills assessment and certification, LanguageCert's main objective is to offer high-quality qualifications to the global learner community. LanguageCert is regulated by Ofqual, the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation in England, and Qualification Wales. It offers internationally recognised, high-stakes English exams that are approved by the UK Home Office for visas and immigration (UKVI).

LanguageCert exams are also recognised by top UK universities and colleges including: The University of York, The University of Warwick, The University of Nottingham, The University of Leeds, The University of Liverpool, Imperial College London, and London University of the Arts.

#### LanguageCert International ESOL:

A test of reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills, designed to provide evidence of English language proficiency for study. Available to take Online from any location including China, or as a computer or paper-based test at an approved test centre. It can be used for UK student visas.

#### LanguageCert International ESOL SELT:

A UKVI-approved exam valid for immigration to the UK (to live, work or study). It can only be taken at a UKVI-approved test centre. Where a SELT exam is not required, candidates can take a LanguageCert International ESOL exam to meet their university admission requirements.

There is no difference in the content, timing or difficulty of **LanguageCert International ESOL** and **LanguageCert International ESOL SELT**. The only differences are in the registration, the exam process (how the exam is delivered) and the reporting of results.

## Nearly 80% of UK universities receiving Chinese students accept LanguageCert exams, and the number is growing all the time.

## 6 The new Graduate Immigration Route

The Graduate Immigration Route is a type of post-study work visa, which was implemented in July 2021.

International students can now stay longer in the UK after graduation. The new Graduate route provides an opportunity for international students who have attained their degree to remain in the UK and work, or look for work, at any skill level for two years, or three years for doctoral students. **You will need to have a valid Tier 4 or Student visa at the time of application.**
