Test statistics

Reliability and standard error of measurement can provide helpful insight into a test's performance. Reliability provides an estimate of the extent to which differences in language test scores are attributable to real differences in language proficiency rather than variations in performance that might have come about by chance. LanguageCert Academic and General tests are scored in different ways depending on the language skill being tested, and this requires different approaches to establish their reliability. These different ways are shown in the Test Reliability tables below.

On the Listening and Reading test components, all test responses are simply scored as correct or incorrect by trained markers. In some test parts, a text or recording is accompanied by a single question.

For example, in Listening Part 1, there are seven recordings, each followed by a single question. In others, tasks are made up of sets of two or more questions associated with one text or recording. For this analysis, the individual items are treated as dichotomous (generating a score of 0 or 1); the grouped tasks are treated as polytomous (items are not regarded as independent of each other, which lead to an overestimate of reliability, but together generate a score of 0, 1, 2 or more for the task, depending on the number of questions).

For example, in Reading Part 4 a single text is accompanied by six questions. Reliability for these two components is estimated through Cronbach's coefficient alpha (α).

^{*} Note that these figures reflect scores awarded by two examiners. Where scores are discrepant, a senior examiner rescores the performance and it is this third score that is taken as final and that contributes to the overall result. For this test form, 13.9% of LanguageCert General Writing and 25.7% of LanguageCert General Speaking performances were rescored.

Test statistics

The Writing and Speaking tests are each scored as polytomous by human judges (on a scale ranging from 0 to 8 points) by two raters drawn from the LanguageCert team of trained examiners, working independently and each unaware of the scores awarded by the other. Reliabilities for these two components are estimated using one-way random intra-class correlation coefficients (ICC), taking the average measures. The reliability of the test as a whole is estimated from the scaled scores on the four test components using McDonald's coefficient omega (ω) as well as Cronbach's α as this has been widely recommended as the preferred option for composite scores (Hayes & Coutts 2020).

It should be noted that the reliability figures reported here are based on a single form of each test, delivered in paper-based mode and to small numbers of candidates. As more data becomes available a fuller picture of the reliability of LanguageCert Academic and LanguageCert General will emerge.
