Interlocutor's instructions

Test time: 11-13 minutes

I = Interlocutor C = Candidate

PART 1 (1 minute 30 seconds – 2 minutes 30 seconds)

I: Hello. My name's *(give full name)*. And you are *(give candidate's full name)*, right?

C: *(Confirms.)*

I: Thank you. Can you spell your family name for me, please?

C: *(Spells family name.)*

I: Thank you. Where are you from?

C: *(Responds.)*

I: Thank you. Exam begins. LanguageCert ESOL International, Speaking and Listening, Achiever level, *(give today's date)*.

I: Now, Part One. I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself. *(Choose **four** questions, one from each of the different topic areas. Name the topic, e.g. 'Now, **Playing games**'.)*

Topics

Playing games

- Which games did you use to play when you were little?
- How often do you do crosswords and other puzzles?
- What do you think about computer games?
- What can we learn by playing games?

Weather

- What's the weather like in your area?
- Which season do you prefer? (Why?)
- What kind of weather do you like best? (Why?)
- How do you find out the weather forecast?

Internet

- How often do you use the internet?
- Tell me about your favourite website.
- How often do you send emails?
- What do you mostly use the internet for?

Buildings and rooms

- What important buildings are there in your area?
- Which buildings in the world would you most like to visit? (Why?)
- Do you think the colours in a room are important? (Why?/ Why not?)
- What's your favourite room where you live? (Why?)

C: *(Responds.)*

I: *(Interlocutor responds and/or comments **briefly**.)*

I: Thank you.

PART 2 (1 minute 30 seconds – 2 minutes)

I: Now, Part Two. We are going to role-play some situations. I want you to start or respond.
First situation (*choose one situation from A*).

A

- I'm a tourist in your town. I start.
Excuse me, do you know of a good place to eat near here?
- I'm your boss. I start.
So [name], is your presentation ready? I need to see it today.
- We're friends. We've agreed to go out tonight. I start.
So, what are we going to do?
- We're neighbours. I start.
My car's broken down. Could I borrow yours for today?

C: (*Responds.*)

I: (*Role-play the situation with the candidate – approximately two turns each.*)

I: Second situation (*choose one situation from B*).

B

- I'm your waiter in a restaurant. There's a problem with your drink. You start.
- I'm your boss. You want to leave early from work today. You start.
- I work in a clothes shop. You want to buy a present for a friend. You start.
- We're friends. We've arranged to go out together tonight but you can't come. You start.

C: (*Initiates.*)


I: (*Role-play the situation with the candidate – approximately two turns each.*)

I: Thank you.

PART 3 (2 minutes 30 seconds)

- I: Now, Part Three. In this part of the test we're going to discuss something. All right?
- I: We want to start a new hobby together but we haven't decided what. Here are some ideas. Let's ask and answer questions to help us decide what to choose. I'll start.

PART 4A (3 minutes)

I: In Part Four I'm going to read something. I'm going to tell you about Hugo and a trip he'd like to take. I'll read it two times. Listen and take notes on your paper. I'll then ask you these questions. *(Allow 10 seconds for the candidate to read the questions.)*

I: *(Read script at an appropriate pace.)*

My name is Hugo and I live in Frankfurt. I'm a businessman and I travel a lot because of my job. I've visited most big European cities but I'd really like to travel to a Greek island one day. I have friends who live in Greece and they always send me photos of their trips to the different islands. I'd like to rent a house on a beach, somewhere not very crowded. My friends tell me that the best time for this is in September, but I'm always busy then so I think I'll have to do it in July. I'm not sure if there are museums or monuments to visit there, though. I think I'd rather relax, anyway... go swimming, lie on the beach to enjoy the sunshine and then try the local food, especially fresh fish dishes. I think I'll just do the same things every day!

I: Now I'll read it again. *(Read the script again.)*

I: Questions. *(Ask the following questions, allowing time for the candidate to respond orally.)*

Questions

1. Where would Hugo like to travel to? *(a Greek island)*
2. According to Hugo's friends, when's the best time for this trip? *(in September)*
3. What local dishes would Hugo like to try? *[with (fresh) fish]*

I: Thank you.

PART 4B (2 minutes 30 seconds to 3 minutes including follow-up questions)

I: Now you're going to talk on your own for one and a half minutes. Your topic is **a trip you'd like to take**. You now have thirty seconds to write some notes to help you. You're going to talk about **a trip you'd like to take**.

I: *(Candidate's name)*, please start.

C: *(Talks.)*

I: *(When candidate has talked for a maximum of one and a half minutes, say, 'Thank you', and then ask some follow-up questions, as time allows.)*

Follow-up questions


- How do you prepare for a trip?
- What are the main reasons that people travel nowadays?
- Which are the main things to consider when choosing holiday accommodation?
- Would you enjoy going camping? *(Why?/ Why not?)*

I: Thank you, *(give candidate's name)*. That is the end of the exam.
